The third edition of the "Meeting of Young Rheologists" has taken place in La Colle sur Loup, close to Nice, from **May 22nd to 24th, 2000**. During these 2 days, 18 participants coming from the the main french rheology laboratories, had the opportunity to exchange on their work in a friendly atmosphere, also with 3 "senior rheologists" (Lionel Choplin - GEMICO, Jean Pierre Montfort- PAU University, and Jean-François Tranchant - PARFUMS CHRISTIAN DIOR) as well as with the organizing team: the CEMEF laboratory. Half a day was dedicated to visit TOURNAIRE, a local company which produces containers for the chemical and pharmaceutical industries. The participants could during this visit have several direct illustrations of the impact of rheology on polymer processing and aluminium forming.

Bruno VERGNES who was coordinating this meeting, got an enthousiastic feed back. The series of the "Meeting of Young Rheologists" will be continued with a 4th edition in 2002. It is open to all european young rheologists who are willing to participate.
