


MARCH TO AUGUST 2015



 5th Southern African Society of Rheology Conference (SASOR 2014) Stellenbosch, South Africa September 2-3, 2014

The 5th Southern African Society of Rheology Conference, SASOR 2014, was held from 2-3 September 2014 in Stellenbosch, South Africa. The SASOR conference was well supported by the international rheological community and a number of local post graduate students. The topics of the four plenary/keynote lectures were Couette and Poiseuille Analogies (Lional Choplin), Melt-state rheology: An important tool to establish structure-property relationship in clay-containing nanocomposites (Suprakas Sinha Ray), Rheology and practical slurry pipeline flow in the mining industry (Angus Paterson), and Interfacial rheology of bacterial adhesion layers at air/water and oil/water interfaces (Patrick Rühs).

• IBEREO 2015 - Challenges in rheology and product development



Following the previous successful Iberian Rheology Conferences (2004, 2008, 2011 and 2013), organized jointly by the Portuguese Society of Rheology (SPR) and the Spanish Group of Rheology (GER), IBEREO 2015 will take place in Coimbra, Portugal, in the premises of the prestigious University of Coimbra, well known by its history of over 700 years. The conference will be held in the Engineering Campus of FCTUC located by the river Mondego. The conference will address the most recent trends in rheology, from experimental techniques to modeling and simulation, focusing on a variety of applications and stressing the importance of rheology for the development of new products. Contributions to the conference are welcome in the following topics:

- Experimental methods
- Modelling and simulation in rheology
- Multiphase systems and composites
- Product formulation
- Interface rheology

- Micro-rheology and micro-fluidics
- Applications (Polymers, biopolymers and biomaterials, biofuels, food, cosmetics, pharmaceutics and health products among others)
- New trends in rheology

Recognized Key Note Speakers have already accepted to participate in IBEREO'15: Evelyne van Ruymbeke (Professor at UCL, Université Catholique de Louvain, Belgium, Institute of Condensed Matter and Nanosciences - -IMCN), Manfred Wagner (Professor at the Technical University of Berlin, and Philippe Coussot (Professor at Université Paris-Est and Researcher at Laboratoire Navier).

The conference is open to the participation of international specialist in the field of rheology and is aimed at creating the opportunity for exchange of scientific experience among participants. Also, a parallel Exhibition will provide, in different stands, state of the art rheological techniques and related equipment.
