Nordic Rheology Conference 2016 Helsinki, Finland, May 30 – June 1, 2016

Between May 30th and June 1st, rheologists of the Nordic countries and worldwide, academia and industry alike, gathered for the 25th Nordic Rheology Conference (NRC) in Helsinki, Finland. The meeting marked a special occasion being the first time the NRC was held together with the Nordic Polymer Days (NPD), as a combined event. Both conferences enjoy a strong tradition in the Nordic region with the NRC hosting its 25th annual meeting and the NPD its 53rd. The event was organized by the joint efforts of the University of Helsinki, Aalto University, Åbo Akademi University and VTT Technical Research Centre of Finland. Credit on behalf of the NRC goes to the NRS board members whereas for NPD it goes to the Society for Wood and Polymer Chemistry in Finland. Sami-Pekka Hirvonen, University of Helsinki, coordinated the preparations of the event.

The 25th Nordic Rheology Conference featured H. Henning Winter, University of Massachusetts Amherst, USA, and Jan Vermant, ETH Zürich, Switzerland, as plenary speakers. The plenary presentations were held jointly and thus participants to the NPD also had the opportunity to enjoy the insights into some of the latest advances and current challenges in rheology. The invited lectures addressed unresolved problems and open questions of gelation rheology and the rheology of complex fluid-fluid interfaces, respectively. A short rheology course preceding this year's Nordic Rheology Conference was given by the invited speakers on the topics of "Advanced rheometric methods: from superposition to light scattering" (J. Vermant) and "Application of rheology to various soft materials" (Horst Henning Winter).

This years' NRS meeting enjoyed 45 oral and poster contributions, with participants from 13 different countries across 4 continents. The engaging presentations were divided into 5 sessions, namely General rheology and rheometry, Food, pharmaceutical and bio-rheology, Particulate and fibrous dispersions, Non-Newtonian fluid mechanics and flow simulation and a separate session dedicated to the poster presentations. The contributions to the NRC comprise the 24th volume of the Annual Transactions of the Nordic Rheology Society and are available online on the society's website (nordicrheologysociety.org). In addition, the NPD also included a special session on Polymer rheology. Two prizes for young scientists were awarded: to Tina Borke, University of Helsinki, for the best oral presentation and to Siegfried Werner, Friedrich Alexander University Erlangen-Nuremberg, for the best poster presentation. The scientific sessions were complemented in the exhibition area by a diverse and strong participation by companies with interest in the field of rheology, Anton Paar Nordic, Biolin Scientific, Hosmed, Instron, Malvern Instruments Nordic AB, Norlab/Postnova, OleiniTec and TA Instruments. Accompanied by a perfect weather setting, participants were welcomed with a dinner reception at the City Hall, within the picturesque cityscape of the old Helsinki. The engaging scientific topics and exhibitions were rewarded the following evening with an exclusive ceremony held at the Old Student House in the very heart of Helsinki.
